



A paw-friendly itinerary: New Braunfels, TX

We've put together two days of tail-wagging fun, perfectly balanced for you and your best friend. New Braunfels is one of the most pet-friendly towns in the Hill Country, with shaded parks, patios that welcome fur babies, and even a spot to get your pup pampered downtown, while you shop next door. Grab the leash and get ready for an unforgettable weekend!

Day 1: Downtown Tails & Trails

Start the morning with a walk through [Landa Park](#), a 51-acre park with shaded trails along the Comal River, including the Panther Canyon Trail. Dogs are welcome on leash (they just can't join the springs). If your pup needs some off-leash zoomies first, [Puppy Playland Dog Park](#) has separate fenced sections for small and large dogs, plus an agility course.



For lunch, [Muck & Fuss Craft Beer and Burgers](#) has a dog-friendly patio (and its own dog menu) or grab a table at [Huisache Grill](#) outside. Afterward, treat your pup to some downtown pampering at [Ruff Town Rescue Boutique & Spa](#), a bone bar, grooming spa, and treat shop where every purchase helps support animal rescue. [Haus of Remy](#) rounds out downtown's pet-boutique scene with stylish gear and full-service grooming. If you venture outside of Downtown [Woof Gang Bakery & Grooming](#) is your neighborhood pet store offering full-service grooming and a wide selection of treats and food.



Wind down the evening with a drink at [Pour Haus Patio Bar](#) or [Krause's Cafe](#), both of which welcome leashed dogs on their outdoor patios.

Day 2: Gruene with Your Best Friend

Sleep in, then head to Gruene for brunch on the dog-friendly deck at [The Birdhouse](#) or [The Gruene Door](#), which welcomes pups on its patio for both brunch and dinner service.

Spend the afternoon exploring Gruene's dog-friendly courtyards. [Gruene Grove](#) has an open-air courtyard with live music and even puts out water bowls for pups, and [Winery on the Gruene](#) welcomes leashed dogs on its patio while you sample fruit-infused Texas wines. [The Grapevine](#) welcomes pups on a leash outside in the garden area where you can catch live music too! Just down the road [Guadalupe Brewing Company & Pizza Kitchen](#) is another solid stop if your pup prefers craft beer to wine or check out [5 Stones Artisan Brewery](#) with great beer, wine and food and a welcoming front porch to relax in rocking chairs.

Where to Stay with Your Pup

[Hacienda del Rio](#) welcomes two pets of any size for an additional fee. [Historic Schmitz Hotel](#) or [Sophie's Gasthaus](#) in the heart of Downtown also welcome pets. [Comal River Cottages](#) perfectly located on and around the Comal River, Petit Cowboy offers colorful pet-friendly cabins in a shaded, unhurried setting. For a more modern option with a full kitchen, [Home2 Suites](#) by Hilton New Braunfels offers pet-friendly extended-stay rooms just off I-35.
